Second Maemo conference in Russia

You are welcome to submit papers proposals and attend the second Maemo conference, which will take place on March 23-25 at Lomonosov Moscow State University, Moscow, Russia. The conference will consist of the Maemo training (**in Russian**) that is organized by Nokia-FRUCT lab at ICT academy in St-Petersburg in cooperation with Nokia specialists from the Maemo team and the conference itself, where small lectures and presentations will be given by the Maemo developers and recognized leaders of the local MAEMO community.
